California Promise: RFA Calendar of Dates

- Dec. 2, 2016 – California Promise RFA released.
- Dec. 16, 2016 – Application technical assistance webinar
- Feb. 3, 2017 – Application submission deadline
- Feb, 7-8, 2016 – Applications read and ranked
- Feb. 10, 2017 – Notification of intent to award issued (appeal period begins)
- Feb. 28, 2017 – Appeal period ends
- Mar. 1, 2017 – Final awards announced
- Mar. 20, 2017 – BOG Approval
- May 1, 2017 – Grants start date

California Promise Overview

College Promise programs are partnerships which align local K-12 school districts, community colleges, and public university segments to provide clear pathways for students to follow in order to achieve their educational goals. A successful program should improve college readiness, access, and the overall success of its participants.

California Promise Overview

- Established by Assembly Bill 1741 (Ch. 434, Stats. 2016), authored by Asms. Freddie Rodriguez and Patrick O'Donnell;
- Intended to encourage “...partnerships which align local K-12 school districts, community colleges, and public university segments to provide clear pathways for students to follow in order to achieve their educational goals.”;
- Includes \$15 million in 2016-17 funds.

California Promise Overview

- California community colleges may apply for this funding;
- A minimum of 20 awards will be made;
- Maximum grant amount of \$750,000;
- Funds to support colleges interested in implementing new or expanding existing College Promise programs.

California Promise Overview

- If awarded, colleges must create and publish a College Promise plan developed using locally established participatory governance processes.
- If awarded colleges must enter into a partnership with local school districts and/or public university partner(s) for the purpose of sharing student data and creating/improving career and transfer pathways.
- Colleges should establish a multiple measures assessment method for placing incoming freshman.

California Promise Overview

- Successful applicants will be notified in February 2017;
- As prescribed in the bill, all applications selected for funding will be posted on the Chancellor's Office website;
- The total award amount will be distributed through the state apportionment system in May 2017.

Integrating SSSP, Student Equity, and BSI Plans

- Development of prototype for integrated program planning, reporting, and financial requirements.
- Prototype shared with key stakeholder groups for vetting and input.
- Refine prototype.

Integrating SSSP, Student Equity, and BSI Plans

- **February 1:** New program framework (planning template and guidance) are shared with the field.
- Regional summits to provide an in-depth orientation to the new integrated program model and information about resources and tools available to assist colleges.
- **June 30:** Integrated plans are due to the Chancellor's Office

BSI 2.0 Requirements

- Within the fiscal year, complete an assessment of its programs and activities serving basic skills and ESL students
- An evidence-based plan for the adoption and implementation of multiple measures of assessment and placement

BSI 2.0 Requirements

- Strategies to improve the successful transition of students to college-level math and English courses
- Priority for Transformation programs awardees or that subsequently implement or expand upon the use or application of evidence-based practices and principles identified in paragraphs (1) to (6), inclusive, of subdivision (a) of Section 88810
