Appendix D: The Los Angeles Regional Network (LARN)

From September 2016 to present, Jessica Cristo, Arnita Porter, Crystal Kiekel, and Diana Bonilla, are regional coordinators and have facilitated twelve 3CSN events in the Los Angeles Region. Co-Coordinators for the Equity Project and the Learning Assistance Project (LAP) facilitated five events this year. Additionally, there is a partnership with Community of Practice, Habits of Mind (HoM) which will provide regional training in the upcoming year.

Outputs accomplished this year include:

- BSI Kickoff
- AtD Summit: Just in Time Tutoring
- Embedded Student Services in FYE Programs
- Introduction to CRTL, the Equity Institute
- LARN informational video
- Increased partnership between the Equity Project and the Learning Assistance Project (LAP). This partnership has helped colleges in the LA region strengthen programs and practices that promote student equity and success.
- LARN also facilitated a variety of activities and events, including an event for BSSOT coordinators and a LINKS event on leadership and integrated planning.

1. 9/9/2016 BSI Kickoff- 30 attendees representing 13 colleges
2. 10/14/2016 LAP Sharing Event- 35 attendees representing 16 colleges
3. 10/14/2016 Intro to CRTL- 10 attendees representing 1 colleges
4. 10/28/2016 AtD Summit: Just In Time Tutoring- 35 attendees representing 11 colleges
5. 11/18-11/19/2016 Equity Institute- 34 attendees representing 21 colleges
6. 3/3/ 2017 Transforming Student Success -27 attendees representing 11 colleges
7. 3/10/2017 Professional Learning Coordinator's Meeting-9 attendees representing 7 colleges
8. 3/24/2017 Embedded Student Services in FYE Programs- 51 attendees representing 15 colleges
9. 4/20/2017 Intro to CRTL- 119 attendees representing 6 colleges

1. The Basic Skills Kickoff Event- September 9, 2016

LARN hosted the meeting with the BSI Coordinators from the region. The event was held at the LACCD. The event had 30 participants from the 13 colleges. Outside LACCD campuses included, Santa Monica, Los Rios, Santa Barbara, CSUN, UCLA, USC, Ventura Community College District, Rio Hondo and Crafton Hills.

2. The Learning Assistance Project Sharing Event- October 14, 2016

LAP hosted the event at Canada College. The event had 35 attendees from 16 colleges. The event focused on sharing of priorities as a region as well as strengths and challenges. The breakout sessions were very successful and the regional energy was very high. One of the benefits of this sharing event was that this Community of Practice has committed to planning future events to support one another's work in institutionalizing efforts around tutoring.

3. Introduction to CRTL Event, October 14, 2016

The Equity Project hosted Introduction to CRTL at Los Angeles Valley College. There were participants from Ventura College. The focus of the training was on how to bring culturally responsive teaching and learning into the classroom and the majority of the event focused on discussions about race. Ventura College subsequently requested additional training on this topic.

4. AtD Summit: Just In Time Tutoring, October 28, 2016

The AtD Summit: Just In Time Tutoring at LAPC was widely attended. There were 35 participants from 11 colleges. Half of the participants were tutors. The focus of this event was to define "Just in Time Tutoring." There was a great discussion with CSU DH who shared their comprehensive approach to tutoring. NetTutor was also present, an online platform for providing 24-7 tutoring to all students. One of the great outcomes from this event is that CSU Dominguez Hills now wants to host an event on their campus next fall.

5. Equity Institute, November 18-19, 2016

The Equity Project hosted the first annual Equity Institute at the Kellogg West Conference Center. There were over 34 participants with 21 colleges represented along with organizations

including Carnegie, Education Trust, M2C3, USC Center for Urban Education, and the John Burton Foundation. The focus of this two-day event was to empower educators in higher education on the importance of having equity mindedness when helping our student populations. There were various breakout sessions that were led by the key note speakers such as, Dr. Francis Kendell, Dr. J Luke Wood, and Dr. Veronica Neal, and Dr. LindesyPiquex. The event was a great success and many colleges requested trainings in Equity in their region.

6. Transforming Student Success, So Cal Region March 3, 2017

LARN hosted Transforming Student Success at Mt. San Jacinto College. There were 27 participants representing 11 colleges. This workshop focused on integrated planning through the lens of Appreciative Inquiry (AI) to support colleges in aligning their student success initiatives and plan with student learning at the center of the effort. This event attracted BSI coordinators and directors of Basic Skills Student Outcomes Transformation Grant, Equity Initiative and other grant funded program directors/ staff. In addition to AI workshops, there were also workshops from the Chancellor's Office, integrated planning and cross-campus sharing on integrated planning.

7. Professional Learning Coordinator's Meeting, March 10, 2017

LARN hosted a Zoom (virtual meeting) meeting to connect with the professional learning coordinators across the region. There were nine attendees representing seven colleges. The meeting's focus was to facilitate a discussion of this year's professional learning opportunities through 3CSN and how 3CSN could be of more support to the college's professional learning needs.

8. Embedded Student Services in FYE Programs , March 24, 2017

LARN hosted Embedded Student Services in FYE Programs at Los Angeles Mission College. There were 51 attendees representing 15 colleges. This Summit focused on the importance of embedding student services in FYE programs to further support efforts of increasing student success such as persistence and completion. Guest speaker, Dr. Mike Munoz, Dean of Student Services at Rio Hondo College spoke about how their college designed and implemented a successful College Promise Program. Participants also were exposed to a panel discussion on powerful practices for First Year students from representatives from ELAC, LAMC, COC, and PCC. Participants created a poster and engaged in round table discussions that help facilitate a

discussion on next steps to take back to their home campuses.

9. Intro to CRTL Regional Event, April 20, 2017

Equity Project hosted a regional event at Ventura College. There were a 119 attendees from six different colleges. The majority of the participants where from the Ventura College District. This workshop provided participant an opportunity to engage in activities and learn tools that will support their efforts in reducing equity and opportunity gaps by helping improve student success outcomes. 3CSN's Equity Project Coordinators introduced Culturally Responsive Teaching and Learning modules on Race and Culture, Mindsets, Learning Barriers, and Social Capital and demonstrated how equity-minded practices support efforts to provide equitable outcomes for students across disciplines and in the delivery of student services. Participants took part in guided activities that assisted them in reimagining their students from a strength-based perspective in order to improve students' sense of belonging, foster engagement, and expand their knowledge networks that lead to improved success. This event was open to instructors, counselors, classified staff, administrators and all who are interested in building capacity for equity work.

10. LINKS 2017: Building Leadership Networks-, April 21- 22, 2017

LARN helped facilitated this year's LINKS two-day conference in Ventura, CA. There were 49 participants representing 23 colleges. This two-day event brought together leaders from the RP Groups' Leading from the Middle (LFM) and 3CSN's Basic Skills Initiative Leadership Institute (BSILI) to create an opportunity where leaders can create and sustain leadership focused on what students need to reach their goals. Day one focused on California Guided Pathways, building collaborative cultures and instructional coherence. Los Angeles Co-Coordinator, Diana Bonilla, led a break-out session on Building Bridges: Peer Mediation at Los Angeles Mission College in which she discussed the power of trust as a driver for institutional and cultural change. Day two focused on building capacity for equity at scale.

11. Southern CA BSI Coordinators Event: Transforming Student Success Through Appreciative Inquiry and Integration, May 12, 2017

LARN hosted this BSI Coordinators event in which 26 people attended representing 21 colleges. This event was open to all coordinators, faculty, and staff working on student success initiatives such as BSI, SSSP, Equity as well as other student centered initiatives including Guided

Pathways and Promise programs. This year's BSI event focused on the integration of BSI goals with SSSP, Equity and other student success initiatives. The goal was to learn and discuss with one another about the strategic planning and coherence needed to align our student success goals and the high impact practices that will meet the students' needs. Participants were encouraged to bring their BSI work-plan as well as to integrate SSSP and Equity plans.

12. 6th Annual SSI Retreat: LA College Promise Edition, May 19, 2017

LARN hosted the 6th Annual SSI Retreat: LA College Promise Edition in which 56 participants attended from 14 different colleges. This event took place at LA Harbor College. Participants were encouraged to bring teams of seven to ten faculty, staff members, and administrators from their colleges. Michelle Ware from MDRC shared research on evidence-based student support strategies. A session on Guided Pathways was also facilitated by John Nixon, Terri Manning, and Craig Hayward. They provided information on national, state, and local high impact strategies for creating clear roadmaps for student completion across the intuition.

Appendix E: Orange County Learning Network (OCLN)

The Orange County Learning Network is comprised of community colleges within the greater Orange County area, which include: Cerritos, Compton/El Camino, Long Beach, Rio Hondo, North Orange County, South Orange County, the Coast Colleges, and the Rancho Santiago District. This past fall OCLN coordinator Danny Pittaway welcomed new OCLN co-coordinator Kristine Nikkhoo, Basic Skills Director from Fullerton College. Kristine helped facilitate the BSI Kickoff event at Fullerton College in September, which was well-attended. Subsequent to that, OCLN hosted two regional Learning Assistance Project (LAP) events, one in the fall at Santiago Canyon College, and the other in spring at Saddleback College. Both events highlighted the role of LAP as a community that promotes the advancement of the field of postsecondary learning assistance. OCLN also hosted two regional Habits of Mind events at Cerritos College in spring. In total, 95 individuals attended OCLN events in 2016-2017. In accordance with the OCLN logic model, a professional learning needs survey was developed and deployed in spring. Feedback revealed that colleges want to continue to learn about the wide range of communities of practice supported by 3CSN. Looking ahead to 2017-2018, OCLN will continue to focus on helping colleges with their integrated planning for BSI, SSSP, and Student Equity, as well as continuing to find ways to connect the colleges to the various communities of practice supported by 3CSN.

9/9/16: BSI Kickoff event at Fullerton College

On Friday, September 9th, 2016, twenty-three educators from 12 California community colleges gathered at beautiful Fullerton College to learn information and share practices related to the Basic Skills Initiative, Student Equity, the Basic Skills and Student Outcomes Transformation, and the Student Success and Support Program (SSSP). The theme of the meeting was “scaffolded plan building”, and attendees worked in pairs or small groups to unpack current campus efforts with an eye toward scaling and sustaining initiatives or activities that could draw

funding from two or more grants. The event was received well, with attendees commenting on the value of hearing about current practices from other colleges and thinking through next steps to take a high impact activity to scale. After hearing updates about the latest information from the state Chancellor's office, attendees identified current student success initiatives/activities on campus by completing an integrated planning worksheet, followed by a Johari windows activity to surface barriers and awareness issues, and concluding with a who/what mapping activity to make a plan on what steps to take to address the barriers and awareness issues raised in the previous activity.

10/21/16: LAP Sharing event at Santiago Canyon College

On Friday, October 21st, approximately thirty educators (faculty, tutors, administrators, and researchers) representing 17 California Community Colleges convened at beautiful Santiago Canyon College for a morning of discussion, reflection, and networking to learn about effective practices to grow and sustain tutoring. A showcase of the tutoring department at Saddleback Community College was a special highlight. LAP co-coordinator Mark Manasse also delivered a presentation about 3CSN and LAP. Looking ahead, participants expressed a desire to continue to dialog about online tutoring platforms, how to centralize tutoring, how to support non-FTES generating tutoring services, tutor-training models, and coordinator training.

2/24/17: HoM for FYE programs at Cerritos College

This event was attended by 22 faculty, staff, and administrators from 11 colleges. See the Habits of Mind year-end report for a full description of this event.

3/10/17: OCLN LAP Sharing at Saddleback College

On the morning of Friday, March 10, 2017, several educators representing six institutions within the California Community Colleges convened in the newly-renovated Learning Resource Center at beautiful Saddleback College. There, guests were treated to a tour of the Learning Resource Center, which includes the library and tutorial services. There was also helpful dialog around challenges and solutions to issues within postsecondary tutoring and learning assistance. While the first part of the meeting was devoted to sharing and exploring challenges, the late morning was dedicated to discussing solutions to those problems by relying on the expertise and experience in the room. From tutor training to scheduling to ways to observe tutors for program effectiveness, many important topics were discussed and many solutions were shared among the group. In all, evaluations for the event were 100% positive, with one guest saying that the event

was “very informative” and that they “can’t wait to attend more 3CSN workshops.”

Appendix F: Central Valley Regional Network (CVRN)

The CVRN is led by Donna Cooper and Erik Armstrong. Through the events that coordinators organize, the region was able to expand the reach of two 3CSN Communities of Practice (CoP), Reading Apprenticeship and Habits of Mind. 3CSN was also able to help colleges begin work with their Basic Skills Student Outcome Transformation (BSSOT) grants and help them integrate their planning for that alongside BSI, Equity, and SSSP, particularly supporting their need for professional learning as they implement their initiatives. During this year, 3CSN has been able to make significant progress toward stated objectives and outcomes. Coordinators have supported colleges in their own student success initiatives, held a BSSOT sharing event, helped colleges integrate planning, personally visited three colleges (not including our own), attracted participants from liminal colleges, and had follow-up calls with all CVRN BSILI colleges. Contact with all of the colleges in the CVRN is maintained via email and phone calls and through connecting at events throughout the region and state.

1. Introduction to Reading Apprenticeship - Delta College

On August 19th, as part of Delta College's in-service days before the start of the semester, Delta faculty held an introductory training in Reading Apprenticeship. This training was part of Delta's work at BSILI and in the RA CoP. While the event was open to the entire region, other colleges in the region had already begun their semesters and could not attend. Still, the event was a success for Delta College with most of the faculty appreciating the introduction and requesting additional trainings and strategies to use in the classroom.

2. West Hills College, Coalinga Habits of Mind and Tutoring Event

On September 16th, West Hills College, Coalinga, hosted a combination event discussing Habits of Mind and tutoring. It was a regional collaboration with the LAP and HoMCoPs, and it was a result of WHC's participation in BSILI. The event also served as a launch for WHC's HoM initiative, FLIGHT; new banners decorated the campus and participants wore FLIGHT t-shirts. This initiative combined faculty, staff, administration, and peer educators (tutors and mentors) around effective habits of mind to improve student success. In fact, many of the participants at the event were students, tutors and mentors deeply interested in learning about how to support students beyond the content.

3. Central Valley Regional Network Basic Skills Kick-off Event

In response to several Central Valley colleges being awarded BSSOT grant funds and to

changing BSI funding and reporting, CVRN held an event in Merced to help colleges think about integrated planning between BSI, Equity, SSSP, and their newly awarded BSSOT funds.

Unfortunately, this event was around the same time as a SSSP and Equity coordinator event, so it was not as fully attended by the region, and while those present wanted more attendees, coordinators were able to have great discussion around BSI's new funding and how colleges can integrate our efforts around these main statewide initiatives.

4. Merced College Introduction to Habits of Mind Event

On October 14th CVRN, in partnership with the Habits of Mind Community of Practice, hosted an Introduction to Habits of Mind at Merced College. This event was a result of Merced College faculty participation in the Basic Skills Initiative Leadership Institute. The workshop gave an overview of Habits of Mind with specific examples of how to integrate the ideas in the classroom and across the campus. This event drew participation from four different campuses, including participants from a local K-12 district. Attendees indicated that they wanted to see more specific examples of how HoM are integrated into the classroom. Attendees also indicated that they thought the session was helpful to increase their understanding of HoM.

5. Clovis Community College Herndon Campus: BSSOT Regional Event

On March 17th, CVRN hosted a regional BSSOT event. It was held at Clovis Community College's Herndon Campus. The workshop highlighted Kirsten Corbin, Dean of Basic Skills with the Chancellor's Office, with an overview of BSI and BSSOT, new reporting processes with the integrated plan for BSI, Equity and SSSP. The event had 30 participants representing 11 colleges in the region. Attendees indicated that they would like to learn more about Appreciative Inquiry. Attendees also indicated that they would like more time to share BSSOT activities with others.

6. Central Valley Equity Summit

On April 28, 2017, West Hills College, Coalinga, held their culminating event for the Professional Learning Hub, which started at the Basic Skills Leadership Institute (BSILI) in 2016. An in-depth examination of equity issues and deep exploration of Culturally Responsive Teaching and Learning, the Central Valley Equity Summit brought an important equity lens to both the Central Valley and Central Coast regions. The event had 24 participants (not including the presenters and coordinators) that represented six separate colleges. Attendees overwhelmingly appreciated the event, valuing the frameworks to have these difficult and

courageous conversations around race and equity. They wished that there were similar discussions to help bring necessary stakeholders to the table in order to have those deep, campus-wide conversations.

Appendix G: San Diego Imperial Valley Network (SDIVN)

In SDIVN, the network is working well to promote regional and CoP work. The region is comprised of San Diego Mesa, San Diego City, San Diego Miramar, San Diego Continuing Education, Palomar, MiraCosta, Cuyamaca, Grossmont, Imperial Valley, Southwestern, and Mt. San Jacinto colleges. In 2016-2017, Anna Rogers, Ted Blake, and Mark Manasse – Co- Coordinators for the region – participated in and/or hosted eight events:

- 9/23/16: Equity CoP – 52 attendees from 14 colleges
- 9/23/16: SDIVN Regional BSI Coordinators Meeting – 12 attendees from 9 colleges
- 10/21/16: Introduction to Habits of Mind – 41 attendees from 6 colleges
- 10/28/16: A Conversation with John Hetts – 48 attendees from 4 colleges
- 4/21/17: Reading Apprenticeship – 45 Attendees from 4 Colleges

The regional network has accomplished a number of outcomes/outputs associated with the region’s logic model. For example, regional coordinators were asked to “bring a friend” to the coordinator’s meeting to increase participation in the network. Coordinators also exchanged shared logic model and received input on how to augment them. Additionally, the network hosted a regional coordinator’s conference call after the statewide BSI monthly teleconference and reached out to local campuses to hold events and increasing participation from area colleges. The Riverside PL Hub resulted in a very large regional tutoring conference and the application of two potential FIER regional coordinators, while the San Diego Mesa PL Hub resulted in an Equity CoP event. In spring 2017, the network coordinators began to develop a deeper connection with the Mt. San Jacinto College location by hosting to 3CSN events around BSSOT Integrated Planning and Reading Apprenticeship.

Events

- Equity CoP

This event focused on an introduction to culturally responsive teaching and learning, and developed out of San Diego Mesa College’s PL Hub work. Participants investigated incoming assumptions and mindsets, and discussed topics like social capital as potential learning barriers. The session was extremely successful, with multiple participants requesting more time and a deeper investigation into best practices.

- SDIVN Regional BSI Coordinators Meeting

Coordinators introduced the concept of bringing a school partner to the meeting along with the basic skills coordinator. Coordinators shared and edited regional logic model and discussed plans to potentially visit each other’s campuses and how to develop our regional website.

- Introduction to Habits of Mind

This event served as an introduction to grit and mindset across the curriculum. Some participants requested a deeper review via the Three Day HoM Leadership group. Attendees appreciated the focus on the affective domain and desired information on even more best practices.

- A Conversation with John Hetts

This unique 3CSN event centered upon the development of both Multiple Measures Assessment Project (MMAP) and The San Diego Promise Program. Attendees participated in a Q&A with John Hetts, focusing on how these two San Diego Community College District-specific programs could potentially work hand-and-hand. Some participants questioned how they could get more involved as faculty, while others desired more information on self-placement concepts.

- Introduction to Reading Apprenticeship

This interactive workshop focused on the whole student. An investigation into cognitive and affective domains across the curriculum, and how the social, personal, cognitive, and knowledge building quadrants work with one another to bolster student learning and reading.

Appendix H: Northern California Learning Network (NCLN)

The Northern California Learning Network continues to build community and connections across Northern California. This year, NCLN and the Far North Region worked together on a range of events; they are two distinct regions, each with its own coordinator(s). This year, Lauren Servais from Santa Rosa Junior College, Kristy Woods from Las Positas College, and Kyle Hull worked together to support professional learning in the NCLN, including colleges in the Central Coast area, such as Hartnell and Monterey Peninsula. Jennifer McCandless from Shasta College serves as the Far North Regional Network Coordinator. From July 2016 to June 2017, these two networks hosted 22 events attended by 744 educators representing 35 community college campuses and 3 CSU campuses. These events were opportunities to facilitate collaboration and knowledge-sharing across Northern California and to introduce educators to 3CSN and its Communities of Practice.

To begin the year, the network coordinators hosted the BSI Kick-off event and learned that participants wanted more opportunities to talk integration; they also wanted more examples of successful integration efforts across the state. BSSOT folks, in particular, were eager for more meetings for help with reporting, idea sharing, and community-building. In response to this, NCLN scheduled two BSSOT-focused events in spring 2017. The first of these two events took place at College of Alameda and the other was offered via a Zoom Conference in early April. Both events focused on integrated planning through the lens of Appreciative Inquiry (AI) to support colleges in aligning their student success initiatives and plans, all with student learning at the center of their efforts. The NCLN also hosted a Professional Learning Coordinator's event via Zoom to bring together the multiple constituents responsible for Professional Learning to help integrate these efforts into comprehensive, powerful and robust programs. The NCLN also hosted the second annual Tutor Expo in early April to further support the Learning Assistance Project.

Additionally, NCLN also hosted the Northern California Equity Institute on March 10-11, 2017 at Mission College as well as providing organizational and facilitation support for the FTLA Cohort at Foothill College through two separate presentations on Reading Apprenticeship. Through these events and the pre and post discussions they involve, NCLN coordinators formed

new partnerships with:

- a) CSU Monterey Bay STEM faculty and administrators
- b) Literacyworks in Petaluma, CA
- c) Several schools within the Central Coast/South Bay Area region who are interested in continuing their work with Reading Apprenticeship and Habits of Mind

Event Descriptions:

A) Making the Invisible Visible Workshop--American River College.

This half day workshop is offered at the beginning of each semester through collaboration with RA-trained leaders at American River College. The leaders and other ARC faculty share their respective approaches for integrating the RA framework and related routines into a range of learning contexts and academic disciplines. As is often the case, participants appreciate the examples from their colleagues and engage in deep discussion regarding their own practices based on these examples.

B) Introductory RA Workshop---

This Introductory Reading Apprenticeship (RA) workshop introduced participants to the RA Framework and Dimensions of Learning. The workshop helped participants surface and identify their own reading strategies and provided demonstrations and practice time with key RA routines. Participants also examined how these routines could be used in a range of disciplines and learning contexts. Offered 3 times this year within NCLN:

- **9/9/16 Gavilan College** 30 participants representing 8 colleges
- **1/17/17 CSU Monterey Bay** 35 participants representing 2 colleges
- **3/31/17 Shasta College** 16 participants representing 1 college

C) 1/2 day RA Workshop in STEM

This highly interactive workshop engaged participants in metacognitive conversations centered on complex disciplinary texts that defeat many students. By discovering and reflecting on their own ways of unlocking STEM graphs, charts, illustrations, and problems, and so forth, participants experienced how the Reading Apprenticeship framework supports discipline-specific literacy development and concept mastery. Instructors discussed ideas for explicitly supporting academic literacy in their disciplines. Offered 1 time:

- **1/27/17 Las Positas College** 27 participants representing 1 college

D) Introductory RA Workshop (ESL Focus)

This Introductory Reading Apprenticeship (RA) workshop introduced participants to the RA Framework and Dimensions of Learning with a focus on the needs of ESL students. The workshop helped participants surface and identify their own reading strategies, and provided demonstrations and practice time with key RA routines. This hybrid event included four facilitators; two in-person facilitators and two ESL faculty members from Southern CA who were able to share their RA practices through Zoom videoconferencing. This was offered 1 time.

- **9/30/16 Sierra College** 22 participants representing 4 colleges

E) Northern California Basic Skills Kick-Off Event hosted by Berkeley City College

This workshop focused on integration, which is the hot topic on California Community College campuses these days, as the Chancellor's Office works to integrate plans. California Community College educators came together to discuss the integration of BSI, Equity, Transformational Grants, SSSP and other grant funding. Additionally, the workshop provided time to explore BSI updates, high-impact practices colleges could be scaling, and the complex process of integration, as well as engage in activities to raise awareness of project/program overlap, highlight current and potential collaborations, and consider next steps in partnering. Offered 1 time

- **9/16/16 Berkeley City College** 20 participants from 10 colleges

F) Habits of Mind Workshops

The NCLN supported two introductory Habits of Mind sessions that offered attendees opportunities to invite students into the habits of mind necessary to find greater success in

college. In addition, the Shasta College event provided a special focus on Student Services.

G) Northern CA Tutor Expo—Need Description of Workshop

Tutor Expo '17, the fourth annual conference by and for postsecondary tutors, faculty, staff, and administrators connected to tutoring and learning assistance within the California community college system, was held in Stockton, CA, at San Joaquin Delta College on Friday, April 7, 2016. The theme for this conference was “Equity,” and coordinators encouraged presenters to interpret this theme broadly. Presentations addressed topics such as tutor training, faculty-tutor collaboration, supplemental instruction, online tutoring, discipline-specific tutoring, program development, and many more. Tutor Expo '17 was offered through 3CSN's community of practice, the Learning Assistance Project, whose mission is to work across campuses to sustain a community of educators toward the professionalization of postsecondary tutoring and learning assistance. There were 112 participants from 14 colleges in attendance.

H) Learning Assistance Project Meeting

To build support for the second Northern California Tutor Expo, Cañada College hosted a Learning Assistance Project meeting. Participants shared effective practices in learning assistance and discussed ways to build a larger LAP community. There were 35 participants from 12 colleges in attendance.

I) Transforming Student Success through Appreciation

This workshop focused on integrated planning through the lens of Appreciative Inquiry (AI) to support colleges in aligning their student success initiatives and plans with student learning at the center of the effort. In addition to AI, the workshop included an update from the Chancellor’s office, including updates on new funding formulas. Participant also had time to engage in cross campus sharing on BSI and BSSOT efforts and related initiatives. This event was offered 2 times.

Appendix I: Foothill Inland Empire Region (FIER)

From July 2016 to June 2017, Rebecca Moon-Stone facilitated two 3CSN specific events throughout the state. In 2016-2017, Ted Blake, Mark Manasse, Jessica Cristo, and Rebecca Moon-Stone assisted, planned, and coordinated for the region two events:

- October 22, 2016 – 1st Annual SI Conference – 179 attendees from 32 colleges
- March 3, 2017 - 3CSN Transforming Student Success through Appreciation and Integration Workshop – 21 attendees from 12 colleges

Multiple outcomes associated with the region’s logic model have been accomplished. For example, Riverside PL Hub resulted in a larger regional tutoring conference and the application of two potential FIER regional coordinators. In spring 2017, the region created a deeper connection with the Mt. San Jacinto College (MSJC) location by hosting two 3CSN events: BSSOT Integrated Planning as well as an RA event. There is a desire to host more events at MSJC.

Event Descriptions:

Inland Empire Supplemental Instruction (IESI) Conference: A Learning Assistance Project (LAP) is a sponsored regional event that has grown into a conference-sized gathering. The leadership team from this event attended BSILI 2016 and worked with the SDIVN regional leaders to bring SI-focused tutoring conference to the Riverside area. The PL Hub participants created a conference leadership team, and already have plans for a 2017 event. Multiple tutors and coordinators presented breakout sessions, with Mark Manasse and Andy MacNeill (both from San Diego Mesa College) acting as keynote speakers focusing on the professionalization of tutoring. Currently there are plans to begin the 2nd annual SI conference in November 2017.
