COOPERATIVE WORK EXPERIENCE PLANS

Approximately half of the community college districts have Chancellor's Office approved Cooperative Work Experience (CWE) plans. The plans are one time approvals and enables all colleges in a community college district (CCD) to offer CWE courses. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT-AB 2558

AB 2558 established the Community College Professional Development Program administered by the Board of Governors (BOG). There are provisions to provide state funding for the support of locally developed and implemented faculty and staff professional development programs when the funding is included in the annual State Budget. The legislation mandated that the BOG establish rules and regulations for the distribution of the appropriated funding. An Ad Hoc Professional Development Committee has been established, and representatives will serve until California Code of Regulations, title 5, pertaining to AB 2558 are adopted.

ZERO TEXTBOOK COST SYMBOL/LOGO

SB 1359 (Block, 2016) requires California Community Colleges to include a symbol/logo in the online version of the campus course schedule by January 1, 2018, and is only required for courses where the textbook cost is zero dollars to students. The Chancellor's Office established a zero textbook cost symbol/logo the community college system has the option to use.

ENSURING TRANSFER SUCCESS CONFERENCE COMPLETES ITS 25TH YEAR!

In partnership with the University of California (UC), the Chancellor's Office hosted [Ensuring Transfer Success](#) (ETS) conferences last month, which were held in five locations throughout California. First offered in 1993, the ETS Conference is a collaborative event by the UC and the California Community Colleges (CCC) system offices. Supported by Chancellor's Office staff, approximately 35 UC professionals were on hand at each event to provide detailed UC transfer information to over 1,100 registered attendees. Sessions ranged from understanding UC Transfer Basics to Navigating the UC System to a Pre-Health Career; new and veteran participants were exposed to a variety of valuable and timely transfer information. STRONG WORKFORCE PROGRAM TIMELINE

With Round 1 of the Strong Workforce Program regional and local plans now certified, colleges are in the process of implementing those plans. The Chancellor's Office is working to develop a risk monitoring process, and will keep the field informed on its release. The rollout timeline for Round 2, which is another \$200 million or perhaps more in the FY17-18 state budget will commence with the new fiscal year, pending the Governor's approval. Required by statute in Round 2 allocations, the Positive Incentive Funding Model is further explained on the [Doing What Matters](#) website. In anticipation of Round 2, the Chancellor's Office encourages colleges to pre-think how best to invest with a focus on student success outcomes (as shown in your LaunchBoard). Strong Workforce Program Planning Timeline: Timeframes for Round 2 Funding Rollout

1. Allocations for 83% of Round 2 will be published to the Web in July 2017 and formally approved by the Board of Governors (BOG) in September 2017
2. Allocations for the remaining 17% of Round 2 will be published in December 2017 and formally approved by the BOG in January 2018
3. Certification of local shares due January 31, 2018 through June 1, 2018
4. Certification of regional shares due January 31, 2018 through March 31, 2018

EVALUATIONS OF FIELD OPERATIONS FOR STRONG WORKFORCE PROGRAM

The Chancellor's Office has sponsored a 360-degree feedback evaluation of field representatives supporting the Doing What Matters for Jobs and the Economy and the Strong Workforce Program. Representatives under evaluation include: Sector Navigators (SNs), Deputy Sector Navigators (DSNs) and Technical Assistance Providers (TAPs). Applied Learning Science Consultants developed a competency-based 360 survey to measure effectiveness and quality of service. Feedback providers include network leads, peers and the community of practice (industry and community colleges). The timeline for this evaluation is as follows:

- September-December 2016 TAPs
- March-June 2017 DSNs
- June-September 2017 SNs

The Chancellor's Office will use results of the aggregated data to identify barriers to successful service (e.g. host college responsibility for ensuring regional coverage and participation) and to develop a learning strategy for these field representatives aligning with the goals of the Strong Workforce Program.

MORE & BETTER CTE FORUMS

In partnership with the Chancellor's Office, the California Community College Association of Occupational Education (CCCAOE) is facilitating More & Better CTE forums at local campuses to educate CTE faculty and other local stakeholders about the resources available through the Strong Workforce Program. The half-day forums include an overview of the Strong Workforce Program, a presentation about how to implement a sector strategy and tap into resources available through Doing What Matters for Jobs and the Economy, and a hands-on tutorial of the LaunchBoard specifically targeted for CTE faculty.
