Purpose: On March 1, 2011, the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced a nationwide, 3 year grant opportunity (RPA), to make grants to the States in order to help carry out export programs, increase the number of small businesses that are exporting, and increase the value of exports for those small businesses that are currently exporting. The state Chancellor's Office maintains an Economic & Workforce Development Division, headed by a Vice Chancellor, under whom various statewide programs and initiatives come under. One of the statewide initiatives includes the Centers for International Trade and Development. Each CITD is hosted by a local community college and provides a variety of programs & services to assist local companies in doing business abroad. The SBA has made a final award in the amount of \$2,540,924.00, to be administered by the Chancellor's Office, to carry out these activities, the activities will commence on September 30, 2012.
