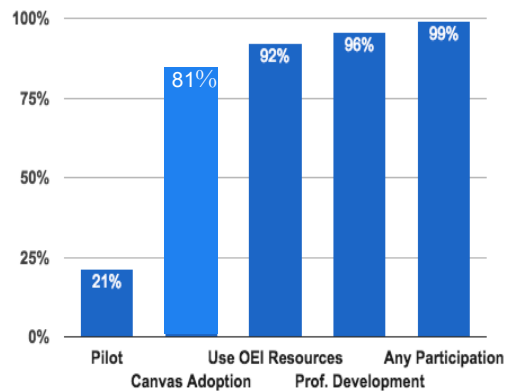




OEI: October 2016 Update

College Participation in OEI - 99%!



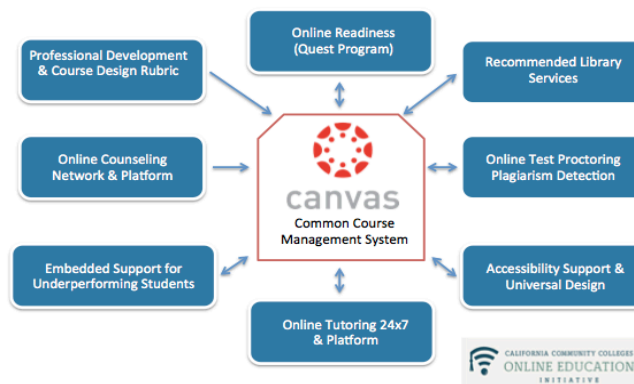
- The College Adaptor is currently being integrated into college systems to create the ability to share data across student information systems.
- Exchange mechanism development phase 1 is ready to launch.
- Canvas implementations are going smoothly with more colleges choosing to adopt .each week. (92+)

MILESTONES

- August 2014: Adopt quality online course rubric and online design and delivery standards
- Fall 2014: Begin peer-review of online courses aligned with the Rubric
- Fall 2014: Launch online learner readiness tools (creative commons)
- Fall 2014: Launch Link-Systems' online tutoring platform and 24/7 online tutoring
- Spring 2015: Select Instructure's Canvas as the state-wide common course management system
- March 2015: Launch underprepared student resources
- June 2015: Launch accessibility (ADA) tutorials & resources
- October 2015: Launch OEI Consortium
- Spring/Summer 2016: Launch academic integrity resources
- Summer: 2016: Over 850 attendees at CCC Online Teaching Conference
- Fall 2016: Launch online counseling platform and resources
- Fall 2016 Begin First Exchange Registration with 8 Pilot Colleges
- By Fall 2016 over 92 colleges have committed to Canvas Adoption
- Spring 2017: Launch Exchange courses with 8 pilot colleges for Spring 2017 classes

- Vericite Plagiarism Detection is being implemented.
- All experimental accessibility tool is being piloted with all pilot colleges wishing to participate in testing
- Course Design Rubric is being revised as a result of comprehensive review.
- Chief Council of Librarians are engaged in resource development via Canvas
- Equity research and planning is underway.
- BCP for ongoing Canvas funds is in the hands of the Chancellor's Office.
- Approximately 20 courses will be Exchange Ready for testing the mechanism in Jan. 2016

Current Online Education Initiative Ecosystem



- New Executive Director has been hired to start in December 2016 - Dr. Jory Hadsell replacing Pat James as she retires in January.
- \$20 million augmentation budget is almost done!
- Online Counselor Course has been approved for graduate credit.
- Course review process is moving to FHDA shop, @ONE will focus on PD for Resources, Teaching, and Tools
