### Summary and Response to Comments Received During the Notice Period of March 2, 2018, through April 16, 2018, Inclusive.

Official Notice of proposed changes to the California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 53413, regarding Minimum Qualifications for Apprenticeship Instructors was published on March 2, 2018. The proposed text was made available for public comment for at least 45 days from March 2, 2018, through April 16, 2018. The Notice specified the process to comment on the proposed changes. No written comments were received during the comment period. A public hearing was held during the Board of Governors Meeting on March 19, 2018, at the Chancellor's Office. Comments from three people were heard. Pursuant to *Standing Order* 206, subdivision (b)(3), the Chancellor's Office has summarized the oral comments and proposed responses below for adoption by the Board.

#### ***Comments Received During the Public Hearing***

##### **Jack Buckhorn, Chairman of the California Apprenticeship Council (CAC)**

The CAC was established by the Shelley-Maloney Apprentice Labor Standards Act of 1939. Appointed by the Governor, the council meets quarterly to conduct the business of apprenticeship in California and fulfill its statutory responsibilities to provide policy advice on apprenticeship matters to the Director of the Department of Industrial Relations, issue rules and regulations on specific apprenticeship subjects to be published in the California Code of Regulations, and conduct appeals hearings.

At their April 27, 2017 meeting, the CAC authorized a 6-person ad hoc committee to review and discuss updates proposed for apprentice instructor minimum qualifications. When setting minimum qualifications for apprentice instructors, Education Code 87357 subdivision (a)(1) directs the Board of Governors to "consult with and rely primarily on the advice and judgment of appropriate apprenticeship faculty and labor organization representatives." Our committee is in support of the Apprentice Instructor Minimum Qualifications before you today.

##### **Julie Bruno, President, Academic Senate of the California Community Colleges**

Minimum Qualifications for Apprenticeship Instructors is an item that is coming to our plenary session and in front of the Senate Presidents to endorse the work here. I did want it to address the question about the qualifications because in our work with the California Apprenticeship Council we found that apprenticeship instructors are a little bit different in Education Code and they're defined a little differently in their role with the community colleges and apprenticeship programs are represented by the California Apprenticeship Council. Apprenticeship programs have a mechanism through their professional development and their training of potential apprenticeship instructors that meets or exceeds the necessary requirements to award college credit.
