\$200M Strong Workforce Program Final – Trailer Bill Language: update by Van Ton-Quinlivan, Vice Chancellor for Workforce and Economic Development

Vice Chancellor Ton-Quinlivan presented on the final trailer bill language for the Strong Workforce Program, including key timelines, deadlines, and deliverables. In her presentation, she mentioned the need to ensure students are up to date with the right skills at the right time for an economy where new technologies are introduced every two to three years, coupled with the desire to help the community in social ability. The CIO and Academic Senate expressed their desire to maintain involvement and the Student Senate expressed their desire to include two members in future activities.

Student Senate Update: update by Courtney Cooper, President, and Mara Javines, Vice President of System Affairs

The Student Senate announced their implementation of a new board and the adoption of a new constitution, and voiced their desire to build strong relations with the Consultation Council and all groups within. The Student Senate invited the Council Members to their Student Senate meetings to encourage further collaboration. In addition, the Student Senate expressed their desire to build partnerships with system stakeholders. The food insecurity, homelessness, and

security issues were addressed by the Student Senate who described their goal to make students feel comfortable enough to come forward and to help guide them to the next step, include creating indicators to monitor and measure food insecurity and homelessness.

BOG Fee Waiver Fall Implementation of New Eligibility Requirements: update by Administrator Rhonda Mohr

Given concerns expressed by various constituency groups about districts' readiness to fully implement the new regulations, Chancellor's Office staff members conducted a survey of Chief Student Services Officers (CSSO) and requested that Chief Executive Officers (CEO) complete certification. Both efforts were designed to identify colleges and districts that were having difficulties in implementing the new regulations so that Chancellor's Office staff members could reach out to see if they needed additional support. The idea of creating a best practices guide was discussed as a helpful option to follow-up with students.

2017-18 Budget Update: update by Mario Rodriguez, Vice Chancellor for Finance and Facilities

The 2017-18 budget workgroup met on June 21st to begin planning for the CCC system's 2017-18 budget request. The workgroup will reconvene one more time subsequent to the September Board meeting to finalize a recommended system budget request. Vice Chancellor Rodriguez outlined four priorities that should be included in the 2017-18 system budget request and welcomed input from the group on modification or items that should be added to the list. The four items discussed include: 1) \$125 million (2%) for access 2) \$75 million for COLA (estimated to be approximately 1%) 3) \$200 million for a base increase 4) \$100 million for full-time faculty. Some key areas without a budget amount that were discussed by the workgroup include the following: technology, professional development, open educational resources and libraries, veterans services, outreach, and campus safety.

State and Federal Legislative Update: update by Michael Magee, Acting Vice Chancellor

Acting Vice Chancellor Magee reported that following the policy committee deadline, the Legislature will recess, returning on August 1, 2016. In addition, bills passing the policy committee in their second house will face the August 12, 2016 Appropriations Committee deadline.

Other: Chancellor Brian King of the Los Rios Community College District provided an update on the two Accreditation workgroups.
