**NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING****Amendment to California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Division 6,  
Regarding Articulation of High School Courses****Notice published on or before May 9, 2016**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that, pursuant to Standing Order 200, the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges proposes to adopt the regulations described below after considering all comments, objections, or recommendations regarding the proposed action.

**PUBLIC HEARING**

A public hearing will be held during the next regularly scheduled Board of Governors meeting on May 16 - 17, 2016 at 1102 Q Street, Suite 605, Sacramento, California. The Board meeting will commence at the hour of 9:00 a.m. on May 16, 2016, or as soon thereafter as the business of the Agency will permit. The room is wheelchair accessible. Other disability-related accommodations such as materials in alternate media, sign language interpreters, or real time transcription will be provided to persons with disabilities upon request. Parking accessible for persons with disabilities is available near the facility. At the hearing, any person may present statements or arguments, orally or in writing, relevant to the proposed regulatory action described in the Informative Digest. The Board of Governors requests, but does not require, that persons who make oral comments at the hearing also submit a written summary of their comments. No oral comments will be accepted subsequent to this public hearing.

### **CHANGES OR MODIFICATIONS TO PROPOSED TITLE 5 AMENDMENTS**

Following the public hearing and considering all timely and relevant comments received, the Board of Governors may adopt the proposed regulations substantially as described in this Notice or may modify the proposed regulations if the modifications are sufficiently related to the original text. With the exception of technical or grammatical changes, the full text of any modified regulation will be available for 15 days prior to its adoption from the Legal Affairs Division and will be provided to those persons who provided contact information and submitted written comments relevant to the proposed regulatory action, or who provided oral comments at the public hearing, or who have requested notification of any changes to the proposal.

### **AUTHORITY AND REFERENCE**

Authority: Education Code sections 66700 and 70901.  
Reference: Education Code sections 70901 and 70902.

### **INFORMATIVE DIGEST**

The proposed changes clarify that title 5 does not require community college residency in order for students to receive articulated credit for coursework completed in high school. Units earned for articulated high school courses should be posted at the end of the term in which they are earned instead of being retained. The title 5 change would guarantee that all students get the same treatment statewide. This recommended change seeks to ensure that students have seamless pathways linking secondary to postsecondary education.

### **ESTIMATED COST OR SAVINGS OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS**

The estimated cost or savings of the proposed amendments are anticipated to be as follows:

Mandate on local agencies or community college districts: None  
Cost or savings to state agencies: None

Costs to local agencies or community college districts for which reimbursement would be required pursuant to part 7 (commencing with section 17500) of division 4 title 2 of the Government Code: None

The effect of the adoption of the proposed regulations will not impose increased costs or new costs to community college districts that are required to be reimbursed under section 17561 of the Government Code. Furthermore, there are no direct costs or indirect costs, or savings to any state agency, no costs or savings in federal funding to the state and no non-discretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
