RE: Formal notification of the selection of the 2018/2019 Host Colleges and Deputy Sector Navigators

This memorandum is a formal notification to the Deputy Sector Navigators (DSNs) and the host colleges that have been selected for the new program cycle starting in 2018/2019, effective November 1, 2018. This notice represents an intent to award \$200,000 to each host college to support the selected Deputy Sector Navigators and regional activities for the sector. A list of the selected DSNs and host colleges is included with this notice.

#### **Note on filled and unfilled DSN positions**

Through a competitive application process, forty DSNs have been selected out of the sixty-six positions that need to be filled, and there are six openings for host colleges that need to be filled. Open positions will be filled through completion of pending interview and host matching processes, or by re-opening the DSN and host applications. DSNs that were not selected during the first round are eligible to apply when an application is re-opened for an unfilled position.

#### **Timeline for selected hosts and DSNs**

- Fiscal agent sends notice of selection for 40 DSNs and their host colleges, which includes the project application forms (Appendix B) and instructions for completing the program application. October 12, 2018
- Chancellor's Office posts the list of selected DSNs and hosts on the Doing What Matters website. October 15, 2018
- Host colleges and DSNs complete the project application forms (Appendix B), and submit a scanned copy to the Project Monitor at the Chancellor's Office and copy the Fiscal Agent representative, [Santoyo\\_Sarah@rscgd.edu](mailto:Santoyo_Sarah@rscgd.edu). October 24, 2018
- Project Monitor reviews the application forms, requests revisions if needed, approves the project application, and sends a notice of approval that includes the host college, DSN, and the Fiscal Agent October 31, 2018
- The Fiscal Agent mails the sub-agreements to the host colleges with instructions for final processing. October 31, 2018

### **Suggestions for host colleges**

- Upon receipt of the notice from the Fiscal Agent, RSCCD, start working with the college's Fiscal Offices and Human Resources Departments to set-up the project budget, and to identify the plan and process to hire or contract with the selected Deputy Sector Navigator.
- Connect with the Sector Navigator for assistance on work plan development, as the Sector Navigators have identified regional activities that would align with the statewide sector workplans, as well as to benefit from their guidance and support.
